The aim is both to help to improve the bridge bidding and play of the newer members and to introduce them to some of the more established members. Three sessions of "Drawn Pairs" out of the well over 300 sessions available to members in 2019 did not seem a burden.

Certainly the 24 players who took part on Tuesday evening seemed to enjoy the experience and certainly the method of drawing and mixing the pairs was better organized than in 2018. (And thanks Francie, for coming along as non-playing Director to help.) Many thought it was a fun night at bridge.

## UPCOMING TOURNAMENTS AND EVENTS

The 2019 Tournament Schedule is in your programme booklet, but of immediate note are **the Paraparaumu Open Pairs**, sponsored by the Kapiti Retirement Trust, to be held on Sunday March 17 (anyone think they have the luck of the Irish?)

Other nearby tournaments in the immediate future are the Kapi Mana Multigrade Pairs (March 10), and the Levin Multigrade pairs (April 20).

The Kairangi Junior section (March 24) incorporates part of a new initiative, a Regional Junior League. Kairangi will run the first of 12 tournaments that will comprise the Junior League, in clubs from the Wairarapa, the Kapiti Coast, Hutt Valley and Wellington. And there are some cash prizes . . . \$180 for first and then from \$100 (second) down to \$50 (fifth).

Another event is also a new event. You know about Sevens rugby, and rugby league Super Nines, Fast Five netball and Bowls3Five?? Well, now there's Wellington Bridge Sixes!! It's a team competition. You need an Open Pair, and Intermediate Pair and a Junior Pair. You play in your own section (ie Juniors v Juniors etc). It's limited to 16 teams and it's going to be held on Saturday, March 16. Why not form a team? There's also a prize for best-dressed team. (Do I recall Chris Farrow and Elva Brown in matching and very fetching Christmas clobber for the Christmas Pairs?)
